HOW TO PRAY FOR A GANG

PRAYER GUIDE





"This is the confidence we have in approaching God, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us."

I John 5:14

God is constantly at work revealing Himself to His creation and offering life that comes through faith in Jesus Christ. Prayer is God's invitation for every member of His family to initiate change on this earth. You qualify to participate and have the ability to join God's work at any time.

If you are concerned and have a desire to see gang behavior decrease in your community, prayer is one strategy you can put into operation immediately. Every gang entrenched young person started out as a baby and is a member of someone's family. They were not born a gang member but chose that lifestyle for various reasons. They have the same needs as every youth growing up and can change with the help of God's mercy and grace. God uses various means to re-parent them and redirect their misguided lives.

How To Pray for a Gang Neighborhood

Choose a neighborhood in your city and begin to pray for the youth who are at risk or already involved in gang activity.

The Old Testament records the practice of Jewish parents giving a blessing over their children. When Esau did not receive the blessing as the firstborn son, he wept bitterly (Genesis 27:4,34).

• Ask God to prevent young people from feeling cursed or inferior because they have not been verbally blessed.

The Book of Judges mentions how the nation of Israel forgot about God because one generation failed to pass on their faith in God and all that He had done to the next one (Judges 2:10). Because of this they began to worship and depend on false gods.

• Ask God to provide Biblical teaching for the youth whose parents have not taught them to respect God or His Word.

Satan mentioned to God that there was a hedge of protection placed around Job, his household, and everything he owned (Job 1:10).

• Ask God to place a hedge of protection around youth to prevent them from joining gangs. Ask God to prevent youth from being use for Satan's purposes.

David wrote that God would be a father to the fatherless, place the lonely into families (Psalm 68:5-6) and receive youth who have been forsaken by their families (Psalm 27:10).

• Ask God to direct fatherless youth to find a church to belong to and be able to connect with a godly family.

Solomon wrote that all children are born foolish (Proverbs 22:15) and are in desperate need of discipline. He said that a child left to himself will disgrace his mother (Proverbs 29:15). Many youth fail from a lack of counsel (Proverbs 15:22)

• Ask God to act as a father who disciplines and counsels the young people who have been left to themselves.

Solomon challenged his sons to give him their hearts or loyalty (Proverbs 23:26). By not wanting to be loyal or faithful to a family, young people's hearts will be stolen by someone else or given to the wrong person.

• Ask God to prevent young people's hearts from being stolen by the wrong influences and that He would capture the hearts of rebellious youth.

Solomon wrote that a wise man overtakes a city by pulling down the strongholds in which the people trust (Proverbs 21:22).

• Ask God to cause youth with a gang mentality to lose hope in their strength as a gang and to feel weak and vulnerable.

Abraham, Moses, and Samuel are three examples of individuals who interceded for those who were not in a right relationship with God. God told Ezekiel that He was looking for someone to "stand in the gap" (Ezekiel 22:30) and told Jeremiah to run throughout the streets of Jerusalem to find one person who deals honestly and seeks truth (Jeremiah 5:1) and He would forgive the city.

• Ask God to use you to intercede and stand in the gap for the young people in the neighborhood you are praying for who have given themselves over to a gang mentality and lifestyle. Ask God to use your prayers of intersession to release his mercy and grace onto the lives of those separated from God.

The Holy Spirit used John the Baptist to minister in such a way that the hearts of the fathers turned to their children and the disobedient turned to the wisdom of the righteous (Luke 1:15-18).

 Ask God to allow fathers to be ministered to in such a way that theirs hearts would turn back to their children and that disobedient children would turn to the righteous for wisdom

Jesus said that His followers are the salt of the earth and the light of the world (Matthew 5:13-14).

• Ask God to use you to preserve righteousness and prevent spiritual darkness in the neighborhood you are praying for.

Luke wrote that the Lord opened the heart of Lydia to respond to Paul's message in Philippi (Acts 16:14).

• Ask God to open the hearts of unbelieving gang members so they can respond to the truth that they have received.

Paul wrote that the god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers so that they cannot see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ (II Corinthians 4:4).

 Ask God to open the spiritual eyes of gang members and allow them to see the glory of Christ and desire a relationship with Him.

Paul said that his ministry was to tear down strongholds or false ideas and claims about God (II Corinthians 10:4-5).

• Ask God to tear down the false ideas and destroy the evil mentalities that are being accepted by gang members.

Paul taught that we as believers would struggle to stand our ground against the devil's schemes. He said there are spiritual forces at work in the heavenly realms and we are to take up His armor to stand firm (Ephesians 6:10-13).

 Ask God to allow you to stand your ground as a believer so that the devil's schemes will not succeed. Ask God for His kingdom to be an influence in the neighborhood you are praying for.
